



We've been ordered to Supervised Visitation. Now what?

Who should I call?

RAFT Supervised Visitation Center is a program offered by Our Home Family Resource Center in Celina, OH. To access RAFT services, please call (419) 586-4663 Ext. 1106 and leave a detailed message. A team member will get back to you within one to two days.

Who should make the call?

The visiting party is responsible for contacting RAFT to arrange their intake meeting, which is where we will collect initial information about their case. While the residential party has the option to call, visits won't begin until all intake meetings are finished.

What can I expect to happen next?

Intake meetings will occur with all parties. On the day and time of your intake, you must bring:

- Any relevant court orders.
- Your driver's license or photo ID.
- One-time intake fee of \$30 CASH paid by the visiting party unless ordered otherwise.
- The residential party may bring the child/children to the intake, depending on their ages. Sometimes, a separate orientation for the child/children will be scheduled before visits begin.

When will the visits start?

Visits won't begin until all parties have completed their intake. Depending upon RAFT availability, your visits may not begin for several weeks until there is an opening.



What days/times will my visit take place?

Visits are held Monday–Thursday and Saturday, with evening hours available on a first–come, first–served basis. The visiting party must defer to the schedule of the residential party and RAFT availability.

How much will visits cost?

Visits at RAFT are on a sliding scale based on income. Visits typically range from \$10 – \$30 per hour. You will find out at your intake what your hourly rate will be.

Who pays for the visits?

Unless a court order indicates another payment arrangement, the visiting party pays for the visits.

What will happen during the visits?

RAFT is a homelike environment with toys, games, a TV, and kitchen space. You will interact with your child/children as you would at home. A RAFT monitor will be present and take notes. The monitor’s job is to be objective. Monitors document what they see and hear. They don’t make judgment calls.

How long do I have to do supervised visitation?

That depends on your court orders and RAFT availability.
